Roundup causes Non-Alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease (NAFLD) at levels Australians are exposed to in our food and water. Roundup, a glyphosate-based weedkiller, has been found in bread, cereal, baby food, honey, beer, wine and water. It has also been found in people's urine and breastmilk. NAFLD is the major liver disease in Australia, its incidence is increasing and children are affected.

"Mothers should be able to feed their children without having to worry that we may be inadvertently setting our kids up for liver disease" said Fran Murrell from MADGE.

The peer-reviewed study, released this week, fed female rats the weedkiller Roundup at very low levels in their drinking water for two years. The study used cutting edge molecular profiling techniques and showed a clear link between Roundup and NAFLD.

The leader of the study, Dr Antoniou, from King's College London said: "Our results also suggest that regulators should reconsider the safety evaluation of glyphosate-based herbicides."

Roundup is the most used weedkiller in Australia. It is sold in supermarkets for home gardeners. It is sprayed on GM crops while they are growing and on wheat, barley and pulses like chickpeas and lentils to dry them just before harvest. It is used by councils to spray parks and roadsides for weeds.

"France has just banned the use of Roundup in parks. We are hoping that Australia will follow suit and protect our children too. We do not want disease-causing Roundup in our sandwiches or on that grass we sit on. A picnic in the park should be a lovely treat not something that puts our kids health at risk." Said Fran Murrell.


